Presidents' Meeting - Munich 24 - 25th May 2026



2026 - European Presidents' Meeting Munich, Germany

On April 24-25 2026, the BPW European Presidents Meeting was held in Munich. The meeting was attended by Presidents and members of Federations and Affiliated Clubs from European countries, a total of 140 people.

BPW International President Diana Barragan, Vice President Neelima Basnet, Vice President Francesca Burack, Finance Officer Gudrun Jakobsdottir, Young BPW representative Izadora Letchacoski were present and greeted all the European members.

The Program began on April 24 at the Bavarian Industry Association building, where Great Place to Work <https://www.greatplacetowork.com/ >, which conducts management skills assessments in companies and provides recommendations for creating a pleasant working environment and work culture, introduced its work. Developing the working environment allows for greater profitability through performance, innovation and employee retention.

Outstanding business leaders from Germany Rita Müller Head of Claims WSE & MEA, Director at Swiss Re and Simone Weyerich Managing Director of Weber Food Technology shared their success stories, whose determination, vision and values have led them to become top managers.

In the afternoon, the BPW delegation was received by the European Patent Office EPO. The delegation was led by Anu Viks, BPW European Coordinator and BPW International Board Member. The main topic of the meeting was girls and women studying STEM disciplines.

BPW Europe brings together over 17,000 members from 30 countries and has been promoting gender equality as an international organization since 1930. The delegation was welcomed by Nellie Simon, Vice President of Corporate Services at the EPO. In her opening remarks, Nellie Simon stressed the joint commitment of the EPO and BPW Europe to building a more inclusive innovation ecosystem: "Europe cannot remain competitive by leaving half of its talent behind. If we are to meet the challenges of tomorrow, women must be at the heart of innovation." The Vice President outlined several measures aimed at supporting women in STEM fields and contributing to a more inclusive innovation ecosystem. These included the EPO's Young Professionals Program to develop female talent and the Girls' Day to inspire the next generation of women to pursue STEM education, as well as the Office's commitment to achieving at least 40% female representation in the workforce by 2028.

In a video interview recorded after the meeting, Anu Viks spoke further about the mission and scope of BPW's activities.

On 25 April, the BPW European Presidents' Meeting and the Symposium of Young BPW European Members took place. Over 100 people attended.

The Presidents of European countries presented their countries, and BPW representatives in EIGE Irma Spudienė and the Council of Europe Pinella Bombaci gave an overview of the latest research, statistics and events.

BPW Europe Working Group Chairs gave the overview of their work – Siiri Tiivits Puttonen Green and Sustainable WG, Women on Boards Eufemia Ippolito, Mariane Pontone Advocacy and Agenda Setting, Conny Montague Learning for Leadership, Radmila Jirkovska WEPs, Pinella Bombaci Charter on the Girls Rights.

Presidents of European Federations and Affiliated Clubs presented the Best Practices. By voting three Best Practices were selected. These were

No Empty Run- Youth Contest
Health Bench - Youth and Education.
- Lithuania. Partnership Women and Money. Responsibility for a Financial Future is in our own Hands

"WOMEN ON BOARDS - DRIVING BOARDROOM DIVERSITY"

Female Leadership and Governance: The International "Women on Board" Summit in Milan and Monza

From the Diamond Tower of BNL BNP Paribas in Milan to the heart of Monza, global leaders gathered to discuss the crucial role of women on boards of directors in addressing the challenges of economic volatility. In an era characterized by geopolitical uncertainty and volatile markets, gender diversity in corporate leadership is no longer just a matter of equity, but a strategic imperative for resilience and innovation. This was the goal of the international "Women on Board" summit, held on February 20 and 21, 2026, in Milan and Monza. The event, promoted by the BPW Europe "Women on Boards" Working Group, chaired by Chair Eufemia Ippolito, was organized in collaboration with BPW Europe and the four Milan and two Monza Clubs of Fidapa BPW Italia.

Milan February 20: *The Strategic Vision on the 27th Floor floor of the Diamond Tower of BNL BNP Paribas*

The summit kicked off on Friday, February 20, in an exclusive location: the 27th floor of the Diamond Tower of BNL BNP Paribas in Milan. The event was attended by key representatives of Fidapa-BPW Italy (National President Anna Maria Elvira Musacchio), BPW Europe (European Coordinator Anu Viks), and BPW International (Vice President of Membership) Francesca Burak. Speakers included prominent figures from the financial and institutional sectors, including Leonardo Patroni Griffi (President of BPPB and Vice President of ABI), Siiri Tiivitis Puttonen (Estonian Business School; NGO-UNESCO Liaison Committee), Nkechi Linda Ifediora (Manager and Public Health Expert), and Izadora Zonari Letchacoski (Young International Representative). The speakers highlighted how female leadership can redefine value creation, redistribute

decision-making power, and improve financial results, enriching companies both culturally and operationally. The panel was moderated by Marietta Cisari, Senior Wealth Advisory Partner at BNP Paribas Milan.

Monza February 21: Best Practices and the Future of Governance

On Saturday, February 21, the debate took place in Monza at the Spazio Eventi Manzoni 16. This second session, introduced by the President of the BPW Europe Working Group, Eufemia Ippolito, along with senior representatives from BPW Europe, BPW International, and FIDAPA-BPW Italia, including International President Diana Barragan, European Coordinator Anu Viks, and National President Anna Maria Elvira Musacchio, highlighted concrete strategies to increase female representation on boards of directors. The panel, "Women Connect Generations," was moderated by Deborah Duncan, Manager in International Training, and featured international experts such as Siiri Tiivits Puttonen (Estonian Business School), Mariella Camilleri (President of BPW Malta), an Expert in Board Strategy and a focus on communications best practices by Rossella Dituri, Head of Communications at Banca Popolare di Puglia e Basilicata (BPPB). The Summit concluded with a celebration of local excellence, which included a guided tour of the city of Monza and a Gala Dinner in an elegant and prestigious location.

BPW INTERNATIONAL LEADERS' SUMMIT



On 6–7 March 2026, BPW International convened women leaders from around the world in New York for the Leaders' Summit 2026: a high-level forum for reflection, strategic alignment, and collective leadership.

With participants from 23 countries across all five regions, the Summit highlighted the strength, diversity, and global reach of BPW International. Leaders from different cultures and sectors came together to exchange knowledge, strengthen collaboration, and shape the organization's future.

Opening the Summit, International President Diana Barragán underscored the significance of this milestone year, as BPW celebrates 95 years of leadership, advocacy, and economic empowerment, calling for both reflection and renewed responsibility.

Guided by the triennium theme "Inspire, Innovate, Empower, Transform – Together We Shape a Sustainable Future," the Summit addressed key strategic priorities, including ethical leadership, peace and conflict prevention, digital transformation and AI, organizational development, global advocacy, and the BPW Listens – Your Voice Matters initiative.

The success of the Summit was strongly supported by the outstanding leadership of PIP Liz Benham and Dawne Williams, whose work ensured both depth and coherence in the discussions. Liz Benham led the sessions on Peace and strengthened BPW International's strategic partnerships with CoNGO and the UN Global Compact, while Dawne Williams guided the reflections on Ethical Leadership, reinforcing its central role within BPW's mission.

A strong emphasis was placed on intergenerational leadership, illustrated by the active participation of young members, whose contributions reaffirmed BPW's commitment to future-ready leadership.

In her closing remarks, President Barragán reminded participants:

“Leadership is not simply an agenda; it is a responsibility.”

and concluded with a clear call to action:

“We are not the caretakers of a legacy. We are the architects of the future.”

Held within the celebration of BPW International's 95th anniversary, the Summit culminated in a Gala Dinner honoring the organization's legacy while reaffirming its forward-looking vision.

More than a gathering, the Leaders' Summit 2026 represented a collective commitment to listen, to lead, and to act together in advancing women's economic empowerment and building a more inclusive and sustainable future.

BPW CSW70 OVERVIEW



BPW International was present at the annual Commission on the Status of Women (CSW70) Events held in New York from the 9th to the 20th March 2026

CSW70: Advancing Justice, Equality and Leadership for Women and Girls Worldwide
The seventieth session of the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW70) was held at United Nations Headquarters in New York from 9 to 20 March 2026, bringing together

representatives of Member States, United Nations entities, and ECOSOC-accredited non-governmental organizations from across the globe.

As the principal global intergovernmental body dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women, CSW70 provided an important platform for governments, civil society organisations, and international stakeholders to review progress, exchange best practices, and strengthen commitments to advancing the rights of women and girls.

Priority Theme

The central focus of CSW70 was:

"Ensuring and strengthening access to justice for all women and girls, including by promoting inclusive and equitable legal systems, eliminating discriminatory laws, policies and practices, and addressing structural barriers."

Discussions highlighted the critical importance of creating legal and institutional frameworks that guarantee equal rights, protect women and girls from discrimination, and ensure fair access to justice regardless of social, economic, or geographic circumstances. Delegates explored strategies to remove systemic barriers that continue to limit women's access to legal protection and remedies in many parts of the world.

Review Theme

The Commission also reviewed progress on the implementation of commitments made during the sixty-fifth session under the theme:

"Women's full and effective participation and decision-making in public life, as well as the elimination of violence, for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls."

Member States and stakeholders assessed achievements and ongoing challenges in increasing women's representation in leadership and decision-making roles while addressing persistent forms of gender-based violence that continue to hinder equality and empowerment.

Leadership of CSW70

The session was guided by the Bureau of the Commission, whose role is to support preparations and facilitate the successful conduct of the annual session. The CSW70 Bureau comprised:

The Bureau represented all regional groups, ensuring broad geographic participation and leadership throughout the session.

Key Outcome

The principal outcome of CSW70 was the development and negotiation of Agreed Conclusions by Member States. These conclusions provide a global policy framework and set out commitments and recommendations for strengthening access to justice for women and girls, promoting gender-responsive legal systems, and advancing equality worldwide.

The outcomes of CSW70 will help guide future national, regional, and international efforts to remove discriminatory barriers, strengthen women's rights, and accelerate progress toward achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls.

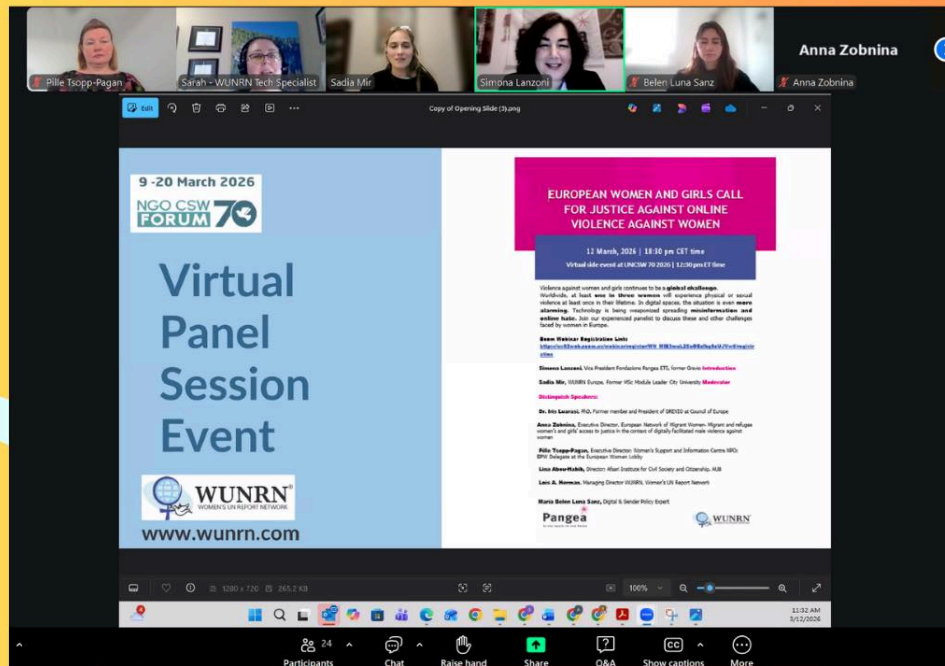
Looking Ahead

CSW70 reinforced the international community's commitment to ensuring that women and girls can fully exercise their rights, participate equally in public life, and access justice without discrimination. The discussions and agreed conclusions from the session will serve as an important roadmap for governments, institutions, and civil society organisations working to create more inclusive, equitable, and gender-responsive societies.

● Raising BPW Europe's Voice

At the UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW70), BPW Europe was represented in a panel discussion on cyber violence against women.

Our member and BPW Europe Representative in EWL, Pille Tsopp-Pagan contributed insights from her work with survivors of abuse — highlighting how violence does not end when a woman leaves an abusive situation.

Digital tools are increasingly used to continue coercive control: from hacked accounts and SIM card fraud to stalking via new technologies such as drones.

These cases show a critical reality:

- While support systems are evolving, perpetrators often stay one step ahead.

The discussion also addressed broader patterns:

- Women in public life — including politicians and activists — are systematically targeted online, often through coordinated attacks combining human actors and bots.

For BPW Europe's Working Group on Advocacy & Agenda-Setting, this reinforces the urgency of addressing violence against women, including in digital and workplace contexts.

We will continue to bring these perspectives into European discussions and advocacy efforts.

● Raising BPW Europe's Voice

How can Europe today talk about family, care, and gender equality in a way that truly engages society? This was the central topic discussed in Brussels by more than 50 experts and representatives of organizations from over 20 European countries during the international conference “Communications Lab Workshop: Shaping the Story. Future-proof Narratives on Gender Equality in Care and Family” held on 29th April 2026.

Among the participants was Irma Januševičiūtė-Spudienė, President of the Business Women's Club at the Chamber of Commerce, Industry and Crafts, representative of BPW Europe for cooperation with the European Institute for Gender Equality (EIGE), and President of BPW Vilnius Chamber Lithuania.

The discussions focused on how European society is changing today and why topics such as gender equality, family policy, and care can no longer be addressed only through formal statements. Participants explored how to communicate these issues in a language people truly understand, one that encourages dialogue, strengthens trust, and unites communities.

More and more European organizations are emphasizing that gender equality and family policy are no longer only social issues, but also matters of economic resilience and long-term societal sustainability. Meetings like this help shape common directions, strengthen international cooperation, and create space for countries to work together in seeking solutions for future generations.

After the event, Irma Januševičiūtė-Spudienė shared:

“Society's strength begins with the way we speak about people, family, and caring for one another. Across Europe today, we increasingly understand that gender equality is not only a social issue. It is directly connected to the sustainability of society, the future of the economy, and public trust in the state. It is encouraging to see Lithuania becoming an active, respected, and internationally recognized voice in this dialogue.”
